Commission staff compiled these tables based on incomplete information provided by the public employers and the labor organizations for the trades. Funding and other information are publicly available for each of the multiemployer plans, but the information provided by the public employers and trades did not provide enough identifying information to be sure that the plan listed is, in fact, the plan to which contributions were made. The information provided regarding the categories of laborers and the plans in which they participate was especially difficult for staff to interpret and understand.

* Public employers are authorized to contribute to both PERA and a multiemployer fund for laborers, operating engineers, and machinists under Minn. Stat. Sec. 356.24, Subd. 1, Cl. 8, 10, & 12, but limited to \$7,000 or \$5,000 per employee per year. Clause 9 similarly authorizes public employer contributions for plumbers and pipefitters, up to \$5,000 per employee per year.
