I also know that without pension reform, the current teacher shortage in Minnesota will only become worse, as more young people hear of the workloads, stresses, and burnout in the profession. As a saving grace, the Rule of 90 works to compensate educators for those years of blood, sweat and tears. As a public school teacher for the past 22 years, I do not have access to the Rule of 90. I know I will not have the energy to do what I do when I am at retirement age (65).
