Dear Chair Her and LCPR Committee,

My name is Melinda Wetteland and I am a teacher at St Francis Area Schools. I am 51 years old and in my 30th year of teaching high school. These last few years I have been paying close attention to my pension and am devastated by the disparity of the 2 tiers and the pension penalties I would receive if I don't teach until I am 65 years old.
I started teaching at age 22 and it is disheartening to know that I would have to spend 43 years teaching in the classroom to receive full benefits. Because the rule of 90 doesn't exist for me, I would qualify for the rule of 108 . This is NOT acceptable. The following are the realities Tier 2 teachers currently face.
*Regardless of years of service, educators must wait to retire because Tier II educators do not have a Rule.
*Tier II educators are handcuffed to their job given the high retirement age.
*MN is atypical compared to surrounding states. Most states have a career rule. A career rule is common practice in teacher pension system.

When comparing apples to apples of surrounding states, you will see that the other states have a career rule. Please fight for funding to make meaningful reform happen this session. All teachers deserve to retire with dignity.
