Schulte, FSA, EA, Consulting Actuary, VIA Actuarial Solutions, the Commission actuary, reviewed the SF1386 cost estimate on the Minnesota State Retirement System (MSRS) General Plan; the actuarial accrued liability would increase by about \$210 million, the funded ratio would decrease by 1.12%, and the contribution sufficiency would be affected by 31 basis points.
- Susan Lenczewski, Executive Director, LCPR, clarified deferred annuities augmentation for members. Dan Hannan, former Minnesota Pollution Control Agency employee and MSRS stakeholder, testified in support of the bill.
- Michael Bergh, former University of Minnesota employee, former University of Minnesota Duluth employee, and current Duluth School District employee, testified in support of the bill.
- Chair Her laid over SF1386.

Action Item: Resolution LCPR24- R1 directing the executive directors of MSRS, PERA, TRA, and St. Paul Teachers to correct errors as provided in current law, as amended by Article 8, Section 12, of the 2024 Pension and Retirement Policy and Supplemental Budget Bill

Ms. Lenczewski reviewed <u>Resolution LCPR24-R1</u> and a memo on the <u>IRS Correction Program and special</u> legislation.

Discussion: Pension options for public safety and public safety adjacent positions in the PERA General Plan such as 911 telecommunicators, probation and parole officers, and county child support agents

- Darlene Pankonie, Washington County Sheriff's Office, testified in support of enhanced benefits for 911 telecommunicators, and referred to the 911 Telecommunicator Working Group Report from 2022.
- Seth Justice Loeffler-Kemp, 911 Dispatcher, St. Louis County, AFSCME Local 66, testified in support of enhanced benefits for 911 telecommunicators.
- Ebony DeLovely, St. Louis County Dispatch, testified in support of enhanced benefits for 911 telecommunicators.
- Wade Laszlo, President, Minnesota Correctional Officer Retirement Association (MNCORA), testified and provided a <u>letter from MNCORA</u> in opposition to adding additional groups to the Correctional Plan, but that MNCORA is not opposed to the study of other options for the 911 Telecommunicators.
- Matt Hilgart, Association of Minnesota Counties, testified that 1) any plan enhancements should not compromise the funding of any existing or prospective plan; 2) increases to any employee-requested enhancements should be equitable and considerate of needs across all generations of employees; and 3) there is employee and employer consent.

Matt Massman, Minnesota Inter-County Association, testified to encourage further discussion on 1) what is the function of pension benefits generally and the difference between pension benefits and the total compensation package; 2) what is the policy rationale and criteria for differing pension benefits across differing classes of employees; and 3) consideration of how disaggregating employees to different pension funds might affect pension stability and how cost will be funded over time.
